Are you registered to vote?

You must be registered to vote in this election by 11.59pm on 16 April 2024, but you can register to vote in future elections at any time.

If you are a student

You can choose to be registered in your home town or in your place of study. You may only vote in one location, not in both.

How to register: easy steps

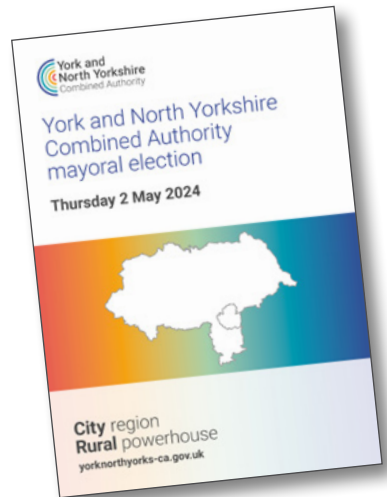
- Visit www.gov.uk/register-to-vote
- Fill in your details: name, address, and date of birth.
- Have your National Insurance number ready.

You will need to show photo ID.

If you're voting at a polling station you need to show photo ID such as a driving licence, full or provisional or UK passport. If you don't have these you can apply for free voter ID by 5pm on Wednesday 24 April by visiting www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate You can also vote by post and by proxy – where you ask someone you trust to cast your vote for you.

If you are registered to vote in this election, you'll receive an information booklet in the post with information about how to vote and an election address from each candidate.

The law says that everyone registered to vote in this election must be sent their own copy so some households may receive multiple copies.
